

They decided to let it grow, taking a form of its own based on their own concepts and ideas, garnered from international travel and experiences. The tranquil environs of this spa promote a sense of well-being by soothing all the five senses in one form or the other ideas and expertise into practice, they knew they already had the blueprint in mind. 

spread over an area of 30 acres of lush vegetation, located in Whitefield, Bangalore. Because the Mathais wanted to create a space where they could carry out the business of well-being in a manner befitting their holistic approach to health care, they naturally ensured that the design and the ethos of Soukya emerged as nurturing in character. As such, one sees that Soukya has a very organic feel to it. Right from colours, spatial layout, forms and even smells, everything here contributes to an elevated spa experience.

This 30-acre organic farm is completely conducive to

peace and harmony as it blends the outdoors and the indoors into one seamless experience. There are private gardens, French windows and glass walls for every set of rooms. Bamboo fences border the private gardens dotted with fruit and flower-bearing trees. The vegetation has also attracted many rare birds and an abundance of fauna. Waterbodies at regular intervals with fountains and fishes help to de-stress a weary guest. Hence, it is not as if one has to be in the treatment rooms of Soukya to experience a feeling of wellness. unique ambience can do it.

Comfort and harmony also come from the colours used across the centre. Earthy shades that cool and have a calming effect have been employed with an understanding of what the spa guest might be seeking. The range of services is not compromised; but the guests are encouraged to lead an outdoor regimen. Keeping in mind the flow and movement of traffic, the private and open spaces are

adequately set apart. Smooth gentle curves coupled with a dimension of scale that is introduced at certain points are very easy on the eye; the pool and the profile of the main building are points in case. Single height cottages scattered comfortably apart ensure that the structures stay unobtrusive.

At Soukya, besides the treatments and massages in the special rooms designated for the purpose, one can continue to savour the spa experience. The textures, forms and materials combine to complete the feel that some have even called life-changing and life-transforming.
